

MEMORANDUM

I have reviewed the following documents:

1. SO AE-108-TX, 147th FIG, 23 Apr 73
2. SO AE-226-TX, 147th FIG, 1 May 73
3. AF Form 526, 1LT George W. Bush, May 72 - May 73
4. AF Form 526, 1LT George W. Bush, May 73 - May 74

Members of the Air National Guard/ Reserve are required to have 50 points per retirement year in order to have a satisfactory year for retirement/retention. Points are earned as follows:

- 1 point for each day of active duty (denoted by 1 in the TD column of the 526)
- 1 point for each 4 hour period of inactive duty (denoted by 2 in the TD column)
- 15 points per year for guard/reserve membership

Looking at the AF Form 526 for the period May 72 - May 73 George W. Bush accumulated 9 points for 9 days of active duty and 32 points for 32 periods of inactive duty plus the 15 points for his guard/reserve membership for a total of 56 points for that year. LT Bush did in fact have a satisfactory year for retirement/retention.

Looking at the AF Form 526 for the period May 73 - May 74 George W. Bush accumulated 19 points for 19 days of active duty and 16 points for 16 periods of inactive duty plus the 15 points for his guard/reserve membership for a total of 50 points for that year. LT Bush did in fact have a satisfactory year for retirement/retention.

This clearly shows that 1LT George W. Bush has satisfactory years for both 72-73 and 73-74 which proves that he completed his military obligation in a satisfactory manner.
