On or about June 20, 2002, in Los Angeles County, within the Central District of California, defendant ALEXANDER PROCTOR obstructed, delayed, and affected commerce and the movement of articles and commodities in commerce by extortion and attempted so to do, and committed physical violence to Los Angeles Times contract employee Anita Busch's property and threatened physical violence to Busch's person in furtherance of a plan and with the purpose to obstruct, delay, and affect commerce and the movement

1 of articles and commodities in commerce. Specifically, defendant
2 ALEXANDER PROCTOR vandalized Busch's car, warned her in writing
3 to "STOP," and left a dead fish and a rose on her windshield in
4 order to obtain intangible property rights from the Los Angeles
5 Times and Busch, including, but not limited to, the rights to
6 conduct and control their businesses and to decide what
7 information and matters to publish.
