

AFFIDAVIT
U.S. v. Robert W. Pickett

I, Timothy J. Moser, being duly sworn, depose and say:

I am a Detective Sergeant with the United States Park Police (USPP) assigned to the Criminal Investigations Branch Major Crimes Unit. I have been employed with the USPP for 10 ½ years. My current duties include the investigation of all major crimes on lands owned or supervised by the United States Department of Interior and/or National Park Service. The USPP also has concurrent police jurisdiction in the District of Columbia. The facts set forth in the following affidavit are based on your affiant's personal knowledge and the investigation conducted by law enforcement personnel.

On 2/7/01 at approximately 1124 hours a white male, later identified as Robert W. Pickett, DOB 3/20/53, SOC 314-50-9438 of 319 Tyler Ave Evansville, Indiana, approached the south fenceline of the White House located in the 1600 block of E St NW Washington D.C. and brandished a loaded 38 caliber Braztech revolver with serial number RH72326.

United States Secret Service Uniform Division (USSSUD) became aware of the armed suspect and sent uniformed officers to the area. One USSUD officer witnessed a shot fired. Later investigation revealed two shots were discharged. The officers were easily identifiable in police issued uniforms. Once in the area, uniformed officers engaged PICKETT. The USSSUD uniformed officers ordered PICKETT to drop his weapon and he refused to comply with their orders. PICKETT then pointed his weapon at uniformed USSSUD Emergency Response Team (ERT) Officers located in the bushes, which were approximately 15 yards from his location at the fenceline.

It was at this point, while Pickett's gun was still pointed in the direction of the ERT officers that a member of the USSSUD ERT located on the southlawn heard the suspect's gun click and fearing for the safety of his team members and others, fired his service weapon once, striking and wounding PICKETT.
